
Inspired by the memory of Marine Lance Corporal TERRANCE DANIEL BECK and his K9 partner SEATO



Terry Beck was born in Dubuque, Iowa, in July 1949. He moved with his family to Fort Atkinson in 1963. He initially attended Northwestern Military Academy in Lake Geneva and transferred to Fort Atkinson High School for his junior and senior years. He played football and was well known as the drummer for his popular band called The Sessions.

Terry had a lifelong love of the military and joined the Marine Corps in 1966. His Basic Training was at Camp Pendleton and Special Forces K9 Training with K9 Seato at Camp Lejeune.

Terry and Seato made the ultimate sacrifice on December 20, 1967, in Vietnam.

## K9 VETERANS MEMORIAL FEATURES

### **Bronze War Dog Statue**



Accomplished local artist, Mark Dziewior, has created the one-of-a-kind War Dog bronze statue at the center of the memorial. The K9, resting its paw protectively on its handler's helmet, expresses the enduring

canine/human bond. Dziewior specializes in animal sculptures, and his work has been featured nationally. He has recently been selected as the featured artist of Madison's 2016 Art Fair Off the Square.

#### War Dogs Logo



The War Dogs logo was created in 2009 by retired Vietnam Scout Dog Handler, Robert Kollar, at the request of the late Joseph J. White, founder of the K9 Veterans Day effort.

#### **Canine Battlefield Cross**



The Battlefield Cross is designed to show respect at the battle site for a canine that has made the ultimate sacrifice. It often includes the dog's harness, leash, collar, water bowl, and perhaps the toy used to reward the dog.

#### Founder of the K9 Veterans Day Effort

The founder of a national effort to establish March 13 as K9 Veterans Day is the late Joseph J. White, a retired Military Dog Handler. K9 Veterans Day is intended to honor military working dogs as well as those working with law enforcement, customs, border patrol, service, therapy, and other venues to protect and serve our homeland and the people within.
