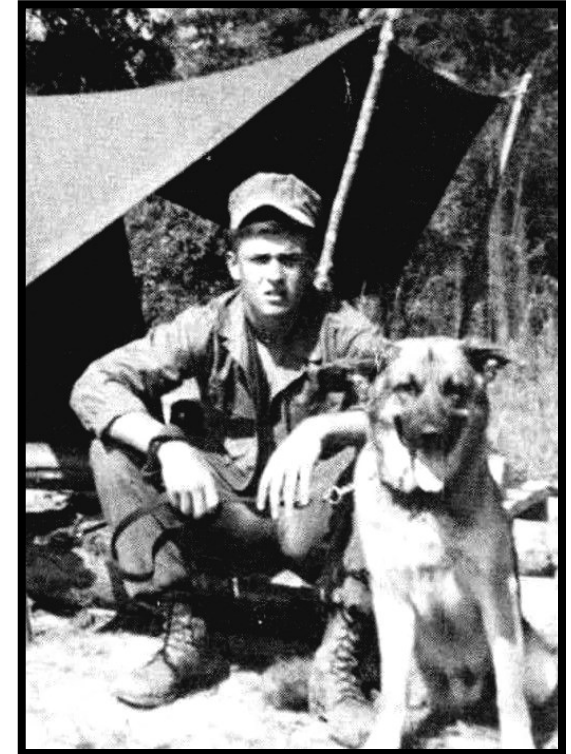

TERRY BECK'S STORY

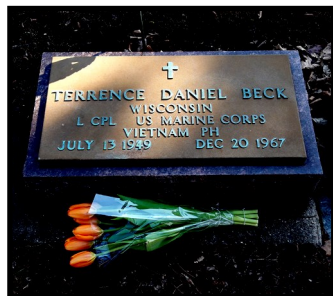
Marine Lance Corporal Terrence Daniel Beck was born in Dubuque, Iowa, on July 13, 1949. He was the middle child of Wesley "Duke" and Millie Beck and had an older sister, Connie, and a younger brother, Ted.

In 1963, the Beck family moved to Fort Atkinson, where Duke was the president of a local bank. At that point, Terry attended Northwestern Military Academy in Lake Geneva, Wisconsin.

Terry transferred to Fort Atkinson High School for his Junior and Senior years. He played football and was also well known as a drummer for his popular band called The Sessions. They played frequently at dances in the community.

Terry had a lifelong love of the military and always planned to make it his career. As a child, he constantly played "army" with his friends, running around the neighborhood with helmets and toy guns.

In 1966, Terry joined the Marine Corps. His basic training was at Camp Pendleton and Special Force K9 training with his dog, Seato, was at Camp Lejeune. They were assigned to the United States Marine Corps, 1st Scout Dog Platoon, 1st MP Battalion, 1st Marine Division.



Terry and his K9 partner, Seato, were Killed In Action on December 20, 1967, in Vietnam. He gave his life in service to others. Terry's final resting place is in Fort Atkinson.

SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION

Donors

This scholarship was initiated by The Kennel Club of Fort Atkinson, Inc. to honor the service of Terry Beck as a Marine Scout Dog Handler in Vietnam. It is funded by contributions made by family and friends of Terry Beck and those who support students who choose to work in the area of protective services.

Eligibility

- This scholarship is open to current Fort Atkinson High School seniors and graduates of Fort Atkinson High School.
- Recipients must be planning to be enrolled in a program leading to a career in protective services.
- Preference will be given to individuals who have a demonstrated interest in pursuing a career with military or protective service working dogs.
- Financial need is not a requirement for the scholarship, but may be taken into consideration by the committee.

Selection

- Applicants will use the Community Foundation online application process.
- The selection committee will include designated representatives of the Community Foundation, the School District of Fort Atkinson, The Kennel Club of Fort Atkinson, the Fort Atkinson veteran community, and the MATC Protective Services program.
- The selection committee may recommend that no scholarship be awarded if there are no qualified applicants.
